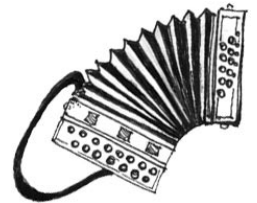
Summer Arts Classes

For the third year, CMCAAs annual Summer Arts Program will bring guest artists-in-residence from Ireland to teach and perform in Columbia. This year we have two music education students from University College Cork who will teach music and language classes in July and August and coordinate activities during our Irish Arts Week. In addition, local instructors Christine Harker and Ellie Grace will be teaching dance classes.



Irish Arts Week, July 14 - 18

Irish Arts Day Camp for Kids Ages 6-13
9 am - noon



Join us for a fun, hands- and feet-on experience with Irish music, dance, language and culture.

Topics:

Irish Step Dancing - Similar to the dancing seen in *Riverdance* and *Lord of the Dance*, step dancing is a fun, rhythmic, athletic form of performance dance unique to the Irish tradition.

Irish Music on the Tin Whistle – the first instrument Irish children learn in school is the tin whistle. You'll learn to play the tin whistle and to play a few traditional Irish tunes. Learn the difference between jigs, reels and slow airs and some of the history of Irish music.

Traditional Instrument Sampler (ages 10-13) – Try your hand at different folk instruments commonly played in traditional music – fiddle, accordion, flute, banjo, guitar.



Playing Irish traditional music

Are you already learning to play the violin, flute or guitar? In this class you'll learn about what makes Irish traditional music unique and learn to play some traditional tunes in the traditional style. Learn the difference between jigs, reels and slow airs and some of the history of Irish music.

Irish Language

Learn basic phrases and conversation in Irish Gaelic, the native language of Ireland.

All About Ireland – learn about the counties, folklore and people of Ireland. Are there really leprechauns? Where are the Aran Islands? What are dolmens and standing stones?

All supplies are included in the registration fee; no special shoes are required for dancing.
